

The domestic worker is obligated to the following:

- 1. Performing the work agreed upon in the employment contract, and to exerted in it the usual care of good faith and honor in dealing.
- 2. Execute the instructions and orders of the employer, as stipulated in the contract.
- 3. Preserving the money, property and secrets of the employer and his family members.
- 4. Respect the laws, customs, and traditions of the country.
- 5. Refrain from performing work for others, with or without pay.

Article 33 of the executive regulations of Law No. 68 of 2015 regarding domestic workers



Dear domestic worker

You are obligated to protect the employer's money and property and not to disclose his secrets

in accordance with Article 15 of the Domestic Labour Law No. 68 of 2015







Dear domestic worker

You must abide by performing the agreed-upon work, and follow the instructions of the employer and his family members and implement them to the fullest extent, provided that the implementation of these instructions does not endanger the safety of the domestic worker or harm his dignity

in accordance with Article 13 of the Domestic Labour Law No. 68 of 2015, and Paragraph 1 of Clause VI of the Standard Employment Contract - Obligations of the Domestic Worker

You must respect the laws, customs and traditions of the country

according to paragraph 1 of Clause VI of the Standard Employment Contract





Dear employer and domestic worker

the disputes that arise between the parties are within the jurisdiction of the Department for Regulating the Recruitment of Domestic Workers to settle disputes

in accordance with the procedures indicated by the regulations issued in this regard. No. 68 of 2015
